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1. Qualitative Information on Semi-Annual Financial Results

(1) Explanation of Operating Results

During the period under review (April 1, 2024 to September 30, 2024), the outlook for the Japanese economy remained uncertain due to concerns over fluctuating exchange rates and increasing prices, in spite of strong corporate earnings that brought about a gradual recovery in capital investment appetite, the job market, the income environment, and other conditions. Meanwhile, the global economy was significantly affected by persistently high prices for resources and raw materials amid geopolitical risks in Ukraine, the Middle East, and elsewhere and by China's prolonged real estate slump, among other developments.

In this climate, the Yotai Group made ceaseless efforts to maintain high profitability. Specifically, it worked to develop new products tailored to customer needs, increase technical service personnel, pursue active sales by leveraging expanded sales bases, strengthen the stable and low-cost supply system through the streamlining of facilities, promote health and productivity management in keeping with its safety-first motto, and reduce greenhouse gas emissions.

As a result, for the period under review, consolidated net sales increased by \\ \pm 336 million to \\ \pm 14,472 million, while operating profit declined by \\ \pm 74 million to \\ \pm 1,587 million and ordinary profit fell by \\ \pm 64 million to \\ \pm 1,667 million, on a year-on-year basis.

Profit attributable to owners of parent for the period under review decreased by \u224222 million year on year to \u211.174 million.

Financial results by reportable segment were as described below.

(Refractories)

For the period under review, the refractories business recorded year-on-year rises in net sales by ¥480 million to ¥12,253 million and in segment profit by ¥63 million to ¥2,286 million, benefitting primarily from increased orders from the ceramic industry.

(Engineering)

For the period under review, the engineering business recorded year-on-year falls in net sales by ¥144 million to ¥2,219 million due in part to decreased orders from the chemical and environmental industries, and in segment profit by ¥44 million to ¥285 million owing partly to increased personnel expenses associated with the so-called 2024 problem in Japan's logistics sector.

(2) Explanation of Financial Position

(i) Status of Financial Position

In respect to the Group's financial position at the end of the period under review, both total assets and total liabilities decreased due in part to the payment of accounts payable – trade and income taxes, whereas total net assets increased thanks partly to the posting of profit attributable to owners of parent.

The status of each item was as detailed below.

Total assets at the end of the period under review amounted to \(\frac{\pmathbf{4}}{4}\)1,324 million, a decline of \(\frac{\pmathbf{1}}{1}\),207 million compared to the end of the previous fiscal year. This was primarily attributable to decreases of \(\frac{\pmathbf{5}}{5}\)1 million in cash and deposits and of \(\frac{\pmathbf{5}}{2}\)9 million in notes and accounts receivable - trade, and contract assets, which more than offset an increase of \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{2}\)9 million in property, plant and equipment.

Total liabilities at the end of the period under review stood at ¥8,760 million, a decline of ¥1,239 million compared to the end of the previous fiscal year. This was mainly owing to decreases of ¥564 million in accrued expenses, an item included in other of current liabilities, of ¥455 million in accounts payable – trade, of ¥382 million in income taxes payable, and of ¥181 million in contract liabilities, an item included in other of current liabilities, which more than cancelled out increases of ¥449 million in provision for bonuses and of ¥240 million in long-term borrowings.

Total net assets at the end of the period under review came to \(\frac{\pmax}{32}\),563 million, an increase of \(\frac{\pmax}{32}\) million compared to the end of the previous fiscal year. This was chiefly on account of a decline of \(\frac{\pmax}{1}\),063 million in treasury shares, which set off decreases of \(\frac{\pmax}{934}\) million in retained earnings and of \(\frac{\pmax}{88}\) million in valuation difference on available-for-sale securities.

As a result, the capital adequacy ratio at the end of the period under review stood at 78.8%. Based on that, the Group considers its financial position to be generally sound.

(ii) Status of Cash Flows

The Group's cash and cash equivalents at the end of the period under review amounted to \(\frac{45}{,}898\) million, a decrease of \(\frac{45}{501}\) million compared to the end of the previous fiscal year. This resulted principally from purchase of property, plant and equipment and dividends paid, which offset the posting of profit before income taxes. The status of respective cash flows was as stated below.

(Cash flows from operating activities)

Net cash provided by operating activities for the period under review amounted to \(\xi\)1,533 million (a decrease of \(\xi\)446 million year on year). This was primarily because of \(\xi\)1,667 million in profit before income taxes and \(\xi\)646 million in depreciation, which cancelled out outlay factors such as \(\xi\)807 million for income taxes paid and a \(\xi\)466 million decrease in trade payables.

The year-on-year decline in net cash provided by operating activities was chiefly caused by the difference between the increase and decrease in trade payables.

(Cash flows from investing activities)

Net cash used in investing activities for the period under review amounted to \$1,286 million (an increase of \$472 million year on year). This was mainly owing to \$1,247 million for purchase of property, plant and equipment.

The year-on-year rise in net cash used in investing activities was chiefly caused by an increase in purchase of property, plant and equipment.

(Cash flows from financing activities)

Net cash used in financing activities for the period under review amounted to \$841 million (a decrease of \$1,227 million year on year). This was principally attributable to \$1,114 million for dividends paid.

The year-on-year decline in net cash used in financing activities was chiefly caused by a decrease in purchase of treasury shares.

(Notes on Going Concern Assumption)

(Notes in Case of Significant Changes in Shareholders' Equity)

The Company canceled 1,070,000 treasury shares in accordance with the resolution of the Board of Directors' meeting held on April 19, 2024.

In addition, the Company disposed of 163,100 treasury shares through a private placement when it introduced an Employee Shareholding Incentive Plan (E-Ship), pursuant to the resolution of the Board of Directors' meeting held on May 16, 2024.

These led to decreases of \(\xi\)1,051 million in treasury shares and of \(\xi\)1,001 million in retained earnings.

As a result of these and other developments, treasury shares of ¥1,081 million, capital surplus of ¥1,710 million, and retained earnings of ¥27,953 million are recognized on the consolidated balance sheet at the end of the period under review.

(Additional Information)

(Transactions to deliver Company shares to employees, etc. through a trust)

In accordance with the resolution of the Board of Directors' meeting held on May 16, 2024, the Company introduced an Employee Shareholding Incentive Plan, or E-Ship, (the "Plan") as part of human capital management with three goals: incentivizing employees to increase the Company's value over the medium to long term; enhancing the employee benefit package; and helping the Company grow consistently by motivating employees to work even harder through equity participation as shareholders.

(i) Transaction overview

The Plan is designed to incentivize all the employees participating in the Yotai Employee Shareholding Association (the "Association") through the following transactions: First, the Company opened a trust account ("E-Ship Trust") dedicated to the Association at a trust bank. Then, the E-Ship Trust acquired in advance Company shares in the number expected to be obtained over the next three years by the Association, through a private placement from the Company and using funds borrowed from a partner financial institution. Hereafter, the E-Ship Trust will sell the Company shares to the Association on a recurring basis. When the E-Ship Trust is terminated, an amount corresponding to gains on sale of shares accumulated in the trust up to that time, if any, will be distributed as residual assets to persons meeting the beneficiary eligibility requirements. Note that the Company has guaranteed the debt taken out by the E-Ship Trust to acquire Company shares. Therefore, in the event that the falling share price of the Company leads to an amount corresponding to losses on sale of shares accumulated in the E-Ship Trust and that the trust at the time of its termination has an outstanding debt in the amount corresponding to such losses on sale of shares, it will be the Company to repay the outstanding debt.

(ii) Company shares remaining in the trust

The Company shares remaining in the trust are recognized as treasury shares in the net assets section at their carrying amount (net of ancillary expenses) in the trust. The carrying amount and the number of those treasury shares at the end of the period under review were \cdot\frac{239}{239} million and 134,800 shares, respectively.
